




Our Approach




- Put relationships at the heart of our work

"Moment of Spark" Grant Opportunity



These grants will provide catalytic, place-based funding with the flexibility needed for trusted community anchors to collaborate toward systems change.

- Through this grant, we aim to foster responsiveness to ever-evolving local contexts, supporting innovative projects that ignite long-lasting impact.
- Currently, we loosely define a Moment of Spark as a turning point – when a pivotal idea, event, or condition starts to ignite actions leading to transformative change.




About the Opportunity

Through the "2025 Moment of Spark" grants, Georgia Health Initiative aims to support projects that:

- Strengthen the capacity of a collective of local leaders with a track record in community-driven change, enabling them to jumpstart a discrete initiative that advances health equity and improves community well-being.
- Address the root causes of health disparities by transforming structures, policies, and/or practices within local systems.
- Are rooted in the experiences and needs of directly impacted communities, ensuring that health equity strategies are developed and implemented with meaningful community leadership and buy-in.
- Identify and invest in creative, place-based, specific approaches that promote health equity where people live, work, and play, focusing on sustainable change that can be scaled or adapted over time outside of the catalytic purpose of this grant mechanism.
- Facilitate partnerships between local leaders, organizations, and sectors to strengthen collective impact and drive coordinated efforts in dismantling health disparities.







Funding Amount & Application Requirements

Who Can Apply

- Tax-exempt public charities as qualified by the IRS under Section 501(c)(3)
 - Applicants may apply with a fiscal agent or sponsor if needed
- Organizations working in Georgia on behalf of Georgians
- Organizations working in alignment with the mission, vision, and values of Georgia Health Initiative:
 - Our Mission: To inspire and promote collective action that advances health equity for all Georgians.
 - Our Vision: A Georgia in which all people have the opportunity to attain their fullest potential for health.
 - Our Values: Courageous Leadership, Trust, Equity, Partnership





Application Guidelines

Applications are open from January 6, 2025, through February 10, 2025, at 12 Noon (ET).

Can apply for up to \$50,000

Budget requests should match the size and scope of the project.

12-month grant period

All awarded projects will start April 2025 until April 2026.

Anticipate funding up to 17 grant awards





Application Narrative

We are looking for your project ideas! Organizations submitting applications should develop an application narrative that covers:

- The aim(s) of your proposed project? What is your Moment of Spark?
- A list of your collaborative members and/or partners.
- Your "proof of concept", why your collaborative is well-suited to enact this work, and the alignment of the project outcome(s) with systems level change.
- Proposed timeline identifying the approaches and activities for this project.
- How the outcome and learnings from this project "inspire and promote collective action that advances health equity for all Georgians."
- The foreseeable challenges you may encounter when launching this project and how you plan to proactively address them.



Use of Grant Project Funds


Project funds can be used for:

- Salaries/benefits for staff for project-specific activities
- Project-related equipment
- Other direct expenses
- Consulting fees
- Grant-related travel
- Indirect expenses

Project funds cannot be used for:

- More than one application per organization
- Capital campaigns or renovations
- Activities that exclusively benefit the members of sectarian or religious organizations
- Grants or scholarships to individuals
- Event sponsorships
- Existing deficits or retroactive funding
- Lobbying


- Select 'Open Funding Opportunities' to begin a new application in response to this open call RFP
- Select 'Apply Now' to begin a new application.
- Please note that at any time while you are working on your submission, you can click 'Save Draft' to save the information and return to finish it later if needed. If so, when you log back into SmartSimple, your draft application will appear under "In Progress."



Accessing the Application Form

Step 2: Completing the application





- Only one application will be considered from each project.
- When working on a joint application, please ensure that only one organization from your collective submits an application through the SmartSimple system.
- If you are applying using a fiscal sponsor, please include a current operating budget and audit for each organization. The organization that is serving as the fiscal sponsor should be the organization that submits the application.
- All budget requests need to be submitted using the Initiative's budget template form. This can be found on the attachments page in the application.

We aim to create a fair and transparent process that allows every participant to access meaningful support in a consistent and equitable manner.

Applicants are allowed up to one 15-minute session which can be signed up for using link in table for date of interest. More than one person is allowed to attend each session if they are collaborating on an application.
